### **Driving onto School Premises**

For those of you who may not be aware, for health and safety reasons, you are not permitted to drive onto school premises between 8.30am and 9.00am and 3.00pm and 3.30pm when the school children are being dropped off and collected. Also, could we please remind parents/carers to only park in the yellow accessible parking space if you have either a blue badge parking permit or a Ludgvan School Parking Permit.

### Ludgvan Community Path Project

Oasis Childcare Centre, Ludgvan School and Ludgvan Community Centre have worked in partnership to create a path to help with tackling onsite parking issues. The path provides a safe route for young children and parents/carers to access the Oasis and Ludgvan School. We are encouraging all parents to park in the Community Centre car park and walk across the path and through the school play area to access the Childcare Centre and School. With the help of NSPCC's friendly dinosaur Pantosaurus, talking PANTS is a simple way to teach your child how to stay safe from abuse. NSPCC's singing dinosaur video is a great way to introduce PANTS to your child. We will be introducing the Pantosaurus video to the pre-school children over the next few weeks. They'll love singing along with Pantosaurus and it'll help them learn the key PANTS messages.
